GIRL GUIDES OF CANADA – BC COUNCIL Provincial Commissioner's Adventure Challenge Information

New scenery, new trails, new faces, new places, new food...everything new and different...that's ADVENTURE!

The award is an Adventure patch for those girls taking part in an official Adventure program.

Any group of girls in Guide, Pathfinder or Senior Branches units, or a composite group within a district, division or area, may plan and carry out an Adventure.

Plans must be submitted to the Provincial Commissioner for approval.

The following rules must be observed when making plans:

1. The Adventure must be a new adventure and a challenge. Preferably, it should take place in locale unfamiliar to the girls taking part.
2. The Adventure may be held on land, sea or in the air, or a combination of all three, and must be a minimum of five days.
3. The girls must organize the adventure (with the Guider being supervisor but not primary decision maker). The girls need to write and/or phone for information, make travel and campsite bookings, plan the menu, do the costing, decide on packs and kit lists, plan the itinerary, etc. Each girl should take responsibility for at least one area of concern. It must truly be a joint effort done by the girls.
4. A log book made by the girls of your adventure is to be submitted to the Provincial Commissioner within one month of the completion of your adventure. The log book will be returned. It should contain the challenge criteria, a list of participants, itinerary, a log of each day of the adventure, a copy of required approved GGC permits (see *Safe Guide*) and the group's evaluation of the adventure.
5. All regulations regarding camping, boating, tripping, etc., in *Safe Guide* must be adhered to.
6. Initial plans must be submitted to the Provincial Commissioner for her approval at least three months prior to the start of the Adventure by submitting a copy of the form on the reverse.
7. A log of the Adventure challenge must be completed within one month of the trip and submitted to the Provincial Commissioner. There is to be one log book for the group, and it should be the combined effort of the girls. It should include a list of those who actually participated in the trip and the other information detailed in #4 above.

The log may be 8.5" x 11" with an expandable duotang-type cover and should be a complete record of the trip, from planning to evaluation, showing how the responsibilities were shared by the girls.

The final decision to grant an Adventure patch to the girls and Guiders taking part will be based on this log.
