GENERAL INFORMATION FOR PARTICIPANTS

DESCRIPTION: This is an opportunity for girls to come individually, with a friend or as a patrol. Have fun exploring the seashore, swimming in the ocean, canoeing, exploring the area, doing archery and making crafts. Participants will have an opportunity to meet girls from across the province and share in the fun and fellowship of camping at Camp Olave.



Participants will stay in permanent huts, platform canvas tents, tipis, or you may bring your own tent if you wish. Please state your preferences on the registration form.

Travel is the responsibility of each participant or patrol. Camp Olave is a 45-minute ferry ride from Vancouver via the Horseshoe Bay Terminal, followed by a 30-minute vehicle ride on the Sechelt Peninsula. We provide bus transportation for participants from the Langdale terminal to and from the camp. Detailed instructions will be sent with the kit list and permission form.

Space is limited to 96 girls. Applications will be processed on a **FIRST COME, FIRST SERVED BASIS.**

WHEN: **July 29–August 5, 2012**
Participants to arrive between **2 and 4 p.m.** on **Sunday, July 29**.
Departure is at **11 a.m.** on **Sunday, August 5**.

WHO: If you are a Brownie, Guide or Pathfinder aged 8 to 14, this camp is for you. Come individually, with a friend or as a patrol of four girls with a Guider. Guiders are welcome to come individually.

CAMP FEE: **\$350. per girl. This includes HST of \$37.44.** Full payment is due with application form.

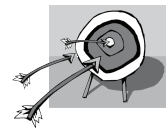

JOB DESCRIPTIONS

Site Coordinator Duties

1. Liaise with core staff, report to patrol Guiders.
2. Ensure that all Camp Olave policies and procedures are communicated to and understood by the patrols.
3. Ensure that the patrols are doing assigned duties.
4. Encourage the patrols to practice minimum impact camping and teach appropriate camp skills if necessary.
5. Facilitate the quarter mastering on site by having the assigned patrol help you prepare the meals and communicating directly with the quartermaster about the meals and supplies required.
6. Coordinate on-site scheduling with core staff and help to make necessary adjustments if required due to program changes, weather or local conditions.
7. Communicate program changes to the patrols.
8. Other related duties as required.

Patrol Guider Duties

1. Supervise a patrol of 6-7 girls for all activities and patrol duties.
2. Liaise with site coordinator.
3. You will be expected to help where necessary with activities and crafts, etc. as required.
