

Screening

Girl Guides of Canada-Guides du Canada (GGC) policy states that women who wish to become Members, must complete the screening process. This includes women who are returning after an absence and those transitioning from youth to adult membership.

Screening ensures the safest environment possible for our girl Members. It involves an application form, an interview with two reference checks, a Police Records Check (PRC) and *Orientation to Guiding*.

The same screening policies apply for Link and Trefoil members.

Mentoring

GGC Mentoring is a proactive program to support and retain our Guiders; particularly, those in their first year of leadership with GGC. New Guiders are paired with a mentor who will provide one-on-one support.

An experienced Guider who wishes to become a mentor will participate in face-to-face or self-directed mentoring training. She will receive a mentoring pin in recognition of her willingness to support a new Member.

Police Records Check (PRC)

All adult Members must have a current Police Records Check (PRC) that meets GGC standards. A woman who wishes to become a Member will submit a PRC when she applies for membership. Existing adult Members are required to submit a new PRC every five years.

A PRC exemption may be granted to a Member who is unable to obtain a PRC, has no contact with girl Members and does not hold a position within the organization.
